WHAT MAKES THIS FOOD FESTIVAL SPECIAL?

SILVER: It's the first Jewish Food Festival to be held in South Florida. Our Temple is reaching out to the community to join us for a taste of Jewish culture, plus fun and entertainment for the entire family. Most importantly at this time, some of the proceeds from the sale of Jewish foods will benefit local food banks and Jewish Family Services, which provides hot meals to senior citizens in need.

Explain "Nosh Fest" please.

SILVER: A "nosh" is a snack or a taste. Everyone will have the opportunity to sample a variety of Jewish delicacies at modest prices. We're certain that no one will leave Temple Beth Emeth hungry!

So, what's on the menu?

SILVER: We'll have Corned Beef, Pastrami, and Brisket Sandwiches, Potato Pancakes, Blintzes, Matzoh Ball Soup, Lox & Cream Cheese on a Mini-Bagel, Noodle Kugel, Sweet &
