# CURRICULUM

## PRE-KINDERGARTEN THROUGH 2ND GRADE:



5th Grade Pet Service

The program for pre-kindergarten and grades 1 and 2, strive to give our students a background in the Jewish holidays, Biblical and Jewish personalities, and Israeli and Jewish music and dance. The Hebrew language is introduced through stories and activities.

## 3RD GRADE THROUGH 12TH GRADE:

In 3rd grade, our students begin their formal Hebrew training and most become a Bar/Bat Mitzvah during the 7th grade while their Jewish journey accelerates through Judaica studies. Post-Bar/Bat Mitzvah students continue their Jewish education by participating in Judaica High School and being confirmed in 10th grade.

Israeli dancing, music and special programs are offered as part of the studies. Every year, we take field trips to The Holocaust Museum and Jewish Museum in Miami. Tzedakah (the mitzvah of Sacred giving), Tikkun Olam (Repairing the World) and Mitzvah projects (the obligation of Jewish life), such as visiting a senior citizen facility and the school participation in the Temple Mitzvah Day, are an integral part of our program as well. Family Programs are a very important part of our curriculum. Each grade level, from Kindergarten through High School, is involved in unique family programs and Shabbat Services.
